Annex: Special admission requirements

- 1. The admission to the degree program International Business Economics requires irrespective of the general and other admission requirements the existence of the professional qualifications listed below, which is to be verified within the framework of the aptitude test according to § 4 of the Regulations on Admission to Master's Programs at the University (MAZugO). The aptitude test determines whether the applicant meets the subject-specific requirements for the degree program International Business Economics.
- 2. Subject of the aptitude test is the proof of the applicant's subject-specific skilled qualification through a combination of the available subject-specific qualifications listed in the following points 2 and 3 and weighted based on scores
- a) in a degree program in which the applicant has gained specialized knowledge and skills in the field of economics,

 at least 150 ECTS economic contents 	with 70 points,
 at least 120 ECTS economic contents 	with 60 points,
 at least 90 ECTS economic contents 	with 50 points,
 at least 60 ECTS economic contents 	with 35 points,
 at least 30 ECTS economic contents 	with 20 points.

b) in a degree program in which the applicant has gained professional knowledge and skills in the fields of mathematics, statistics, and quantitative methods (MSQM),

 at least 90 ECTS MSQM 	with 40 points,
 at least 60 ECTS MSQM 	with 30 points,
 at least 30 ECTS MSQM 	with 25 points,
 at least 15 ECTS MSQM 	with 15 points.

c) in a degree program in which the applicant has gained professional knowledge and skills in the field of media and communication studies (MKW),

_	at least 60 ECTS MKW	with 20 points,
_	at least 20 ECTS MKW	with 10 points.

Scores can only be awarded once for each of a) to c).

d) Applicants who are not able to present a degree with the contents mentioned in a) to c) are not suitable for the Master's program in International Business Economics. In this case, the aptitude test is to be assessed as "Special admission requirements not met".

3. Furthermore, the degree of qualification is assessed according to the final grade:

very good	with 20 points,
- good	with 15 points,
satisfactory	with 10 points.

- 4. When the applicant achieves according to the assessments in sections 2 and 3
 - a) a total score of 70 points or more, the aptitude test is to be assessed as "Special admission requirements met".
 - b) not the total score of 70, but at least 50 points, the positive prognosis is considered to have been given for the aptitude test that the professional qualifications lacking at the time of the decision can be achieved in the course of the intended Master's program (§ 4 para. 4 sentence 1 letter b) MAZugO). The aptitude test is to be assessed with "Special access requirements met". In this case, the Examination Committee shall determine the academic achievements and examinations required for a successful Master's degree and to be additionally performed/achieved as requirements during the studies (§ 4, para. 4, sentence 2 MAZugO). The academic workload may not exceed a total of 15 credit points in the case of a total score of 60 points or more, and a total of 30 credit points in the case of a total score of less than 60 points.
 - c) a total score of less than 50 points, the aptitude test is to be assessed as "Special admission requirements not met" (§ 4 para. 4, sentence 4; para. 6, sentence 1 MAZugO).
- 5. The requirements to be met are modules of the university, which are included in the curriculum of the degree program International Business Economics.
- 6. The assessments pursuant to items 2 and 3 shall be made based on the files. Section 4 (2) sentence 2 MAZugO remains unaffected.
