Hmm, okay, That's interesting... To summarise briefly, we've been searching using the keyword 'time machine'. I think we need a different approach to find what we're looking for. To achieve this, we need a list of keywords from all the books we've found so far. When conducting any search, it is important to continually refine the results in order to avoid accidentally excluding relevant hits or including irrelevant ones. This means expanding or narrowing down the set of results. One way to achieve this is by adding additional search terms or keywords, or using truncation. Currently, our set of results is quite small. Therefore, we need alternative keywords. We will now collect a list of all related words (including synonyms, translations, narrower and broader terms, and related terms) for the term 'time travel'.		continue
